Dear People of God,

As we make our way through Lent, we should take time each week to reflect on how well we've made use of the famous old "Lenten Practices" (1) to assist the needs of others and (2) to perfect our own style of life to make it more like that of Jesus. In case you've forgotten them, they are almsgiving, prayer, good works, and fasting and abstaining on the days appointed. Each of these activities is meant to provide a focus for our thoughtful approach to day-to-day behaviors during the forty days leading up to Easter so they will have become the good habits which guide our lives the rest of the year.

In the Church, habits (the good ones anyway) are called rituals and are meant to assure that some particular blessing of God is passed on through us to the world. In many ways, our lives are all ritual, repeated actions and behaviors which make life easier and reduce stress by leading us along familiar pathways. Think of the pattern you follow each morning when you get up; then mix things up some morning and you'll find that the entire day goes wrong. Most of us will drive the same route to work or to our vacation cottage without thinking about it and we resist the kids asking to go some other way.

Human beings love rituals because we are built to be ritualistic. In fact, this is the result of the way we think or try not to. A habit or ritual reduces the energy required to get things done and we're nothing if not efficient in our use of the energy expended by our brain. God took advantage of that when he gave us the sacraments, all of which invite us to begin the good habits of our faith. Unfortunately other habits intrude and begin to erode those faith habits; during Lent we try to bring them back up to full speed.

By way of an example, as children we all learned a few basic prayers but over time distractions like the television, texting, and social media take away the time we used to use honing the habit of saying those prayers. I've actually met people who have forgotten the Lord's Prayer and others who don't recall ever learning the Glory Be which, as I recall, was one of the Sisters' expectations given that it puts us in the presence of the Trinity.

Picking up a prayerbook during Lent revives our knowledge and perhaps revives the habit of when and how to make use of that prayer and others we may have allowed to slip out of common use. To grow beyond those simple rote prayers and develop the habit of dialogue with God, we can use some excellent devices like the Little Black Book which has a thoughtful and brief entry for each day of the season.

We learn from the gospels that Jesus had good habits and we can as well if we truly undertake the Lenten Practices.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.




