Dear People of God,

Every now and then I believe it's a good idea to do a letter on proper etiquette at Mass, especially regarding the reception of the Eucharist as we approach the altar. I know that many of us have our own perception of the proper piety. However, I want to recall that the assembled bishops, liturgists and advisors at the Second Vatican Council deliberated for some time on how to receive the Eucharist: they agreed that the proper way is to place the right hand over the left and accept the Christ into our hands while standing at the altar.

If you examine the debates and conferences which led to that request, you'll find that there were a couple of issues at play. Perhaps the most important was the misperception of reverential piety and unworthiness. People tend to think they are unworthy to hold the sacred presence of God. The Council determined that such thinking violates the words we say just before coming to the altar: Lord I am not worthy, but only say the word. God has said the word and we are thus made worthy. In a sense, when we refuse to follow the guidance of the bishops, we deny the capacity of God to make us worthy. Not a good idea.

Another reason to receive on the hand relates to the sinfulness of the ordinary person. People tend to think that their hands are more sinful than their tongue. Not so. Most people gossip, tell lies about themselves and others, use foul language, complain and otherwise use their tongue to do untold damage in the world. If we want to use a less sinful part of the body for Communion, the hand meets that test.

A few people will say that they like receiving on the tongue because they're being fed by Jesus. History and the accounts of the Last Supper put that one to rest quickly. At the paschal supper the oldest male present would "break the bread" and pass it around to the others a the table; he did not place it in their mouths because the entire idea was to accept, reflect and then share. Even the Jesus movies get this one right.

There is no really good reason to receive Communion on the tongue but every good reason to take it in our hands. Accepting the Christ in our hands shows obedience to those entrusted by the Holy Spirit with our spiritual welfare. Obedience was the one thing God asked of Adam and disobedience has been the downfall of us humans ever since.

As for kneeling to receive, the bishops asked us not to do that as it might trip the person behind us and cause serious injury. Standing also recognizes that in the Eucharist, Christ considers us his equals, not his inferiors; He welcomes us into union not as slaves or servants, but as partners in the pilgrimage of life.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
