Dear People of God,

I suspect we've all managed to devour the Easter candy and put the decorative bunny away until next year, but I remind you that Easter is so important a festival in the Church that it is celebrated for six weeks. In the time between the celebration of Jesus' resurrection and his ascension fifty days later, the Church reflects on the scriptural texts which deal with all the things he was doing during those days to strengthen the faith of his disciples so they could take up the challenge of evangelizing the world. That's more than a retelling of something that happened two thousand years ago but is Jesus asking us to do the same - to strengthen our faith to meet the challenges of evangelization.

At Baptism each of us was given the task of sharing the Good News with others by a way of life that shows we're in union with God and especially the Holy Spirit. Most of us will develop a way of life which is modeled on what we see in others as we grow up. Parents are always the first models; that's why at baptism there's a blessing which asks God to make Mom and Dad "the first and best teachers of faith."

It makes sense that the family, which St. John Paul II always referred to as the unit cell of the Church, plays that role because children are with them far more than anywhere else. The Church may be able to speak to children an hour a week and teachers a few hours a week, but Mom and Dad have them the rest of the time. That means Mom and Dad ought to be living the faith so their daughters and sons can see it. Families should pray together and parents should talk about God and faith.

St. John Paul II put together a wonderfully written document, "Letter to Families" in which he laid out a few simple ways that parents can fulfill their roles as those "first and best teachers of faith." You can find it at Reger's or at many parishes which feature the Knights of Columbus pamphlet series. It would make a great gift when a child, grandchild, niece, or nephew is being baptized so parents can come to grips with what they agreed to when they said "yes" to "Are you prepared to accept this responsibility?"

Of course, there are many others who can assist Mom and Dad in revealing faith to their children. All of us at Church can do so by supporting families, being kind and attentive to children, even the ones trying to sing Alleluia at the top of their lungs without knowing the words. Perhaps the best evangelism for children is just to come to Church feeling happy to be there, smiling and enjoying the presence of Jesus and others sharing the same faith.

# The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.








Please continue to pray for vocations. Perhaps the intention could be added to our weekly rosary. With Mary as our advocate, we are indeed strengthened.
