Dear People of God,

Today the Church celebrates Pentecost, the day the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles and the Church began its evangelization of the world. The Holy Spirit gets very little press in the Church, hardly a mention beyond the third person of the Trinity when we sign ourselves into church for Mass or some other service. Yet it is the Spirit of God which dwells in the Church and provides not only divine guidance but a divine protection against the human foibles which could so easily upend a secular society. We trust the Holy Spirit to guide the Holy Father in choosing our bishops and to guide the cardinal electors in choosing a new pope.

Pentecost gives us some hints about the Holy Spirit which might help us understand what we ought to be doing since we've been gifted with the Spirit, especially in Confirmation. First came a rushing of wind, a sense of the raw power of God unleashed into the lives of the Apostles and now into each one of us. There are all kinds of references to the breath of God or the wind/whisper with which God communicated with the Old Testament prophets and kings. That would suggest that the Holy Spirit is the primary communicator from God to any one of us.

Then tongues of fire appeared. Fire is both a blessing and a terrible danger. We can toss a log into the fireplace and warm our home with a glowing, sparkling light or we can watch fire race through a forest, across a prairie and destroy everything in its path. The suggestion here is the warmth of the presence of God matched to the amazing speed with which that warmth can spread, destroying in its wake all that troubles the world and allowing new, green life to appear.

The Apostles understood the Holy Spirit as the great source of universality on earth; that's why they could charge up to the roof and share the Good News so that everybody could understand it. The missions were born with that understanding. Only one of the Apostles remained close to home to serve the needs of the community in ancient Israel; all the others took off and within a generation transformed the world, a transformation which continues even today.

As we pause to reflect on and better grasp the presence of the Spirit, take time to open your heart to the rushing wind, the blazing fire and the desire to charge out of the doors of the Church to tell somebody the good news!

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

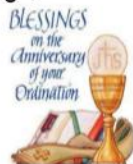

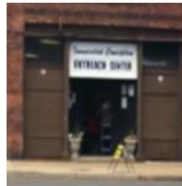

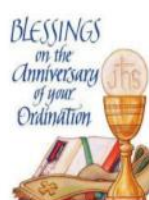

Seasonally Related Triggers. While the term "seasonal allergies" generally refers to grass, pollen and mold, there is a different group of triggers that are closely tied to particular seasons.

Among them:

- Smoke (campfires in summer, fireplaces in winter)
- Insect bites and stings (usually in spring and summer)
- Chlorine in indoor and outdoor swimming pools
- Candy ingredients (Halloween, Christmas, Valentine's Day, Easter)
- Pine trees and wreaths (Thanksgiving to Christmas)

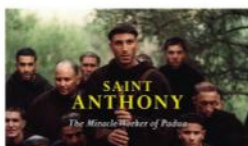

Blood Donation Facts:

1. Every TWO seconds in the US, someone needs blood or blood products.
2. Average donor gives 1.67 times per year when they are eligible to give 6 times per year.
3. Your blood donation may save up to Three lives! Where else can you spend about an hour and save three lives?
1. The Average adult has 10 pints of blood. You donate one pint. Yes, one tenth!
2. Out of 100 people, 36 are eligible to donate, BUT only 6 actually donate!
