Dear People of God,

Today the Church celebrates the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. It's a solemnity which reminds us that in the Most Holy Eucharist, we truly receive both the body and blood, the humanity and divinity of Jesus.

A few decades ago, a famous Catholic priest/sociologist, Andrew Greeley from Chicago, did some surveys that suggested two-thirds of the people coming to Mass don't believe what I just wrote in the opening 2 sentences. (Using the internet, you can look him up and his surveys should you so desire.) I'm not sure what they do believe – or perhaps all the empty pews are because the non-believers can't find a reason to come to Mass. Nevertheless, our entire ecclesial community is built on the foundation of Jesus being really present in the Eucharist.

Our understanding of this marvelous sacrament that unites us to our loving God might be misinterpreted by some who think they ought to be able to feel that divine presence. Most of us don't because it occurs in the soul, not in our body or our mind. Remember, the soul is the essential element which makes us fully human so that our fully human self is where the fully present Jesus finds us.

I've made the point before that instead of praying to God at the Eucharist, we should listen for God. Listening isn't a very highly developed human trait so it isn't easy. Instead, we allow ourselves to be distracted by the music or the statues or the little kid crawling happily in the pew just in front of us. Because distractions are a very developed human trait, we often miss the gentle whisper in our soul – a loving God making himself welcome within us.

Years ago this day, called Corpus Christi, included formal processions with a number of stops along the way where the Eucharist was put up on altars built by Catholic families for veneration; a Benediction occurred before moving on to the next stop. It gave people an external vision of what was happening in the soul. Today there's little traction for processions of any kind in most American parishes unlike the continuing tradition of the Corpus Christi procession in most of the rest of the world. Our American Church doesn't look or sound like the rest of the world, perhaps because we've got too much to do: work, the demands of our busy lives and the fast pace of those lives precludes getting overly involved in Church.

As we take part in this miracle of God's love today, let's do our best to enter into the festival of Jesus' true presence. As we depart the building, let us take Jesus along for our own personal procession to wherever we go next. May the blessings of Jesus within energize you and your family to live in the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ today and always.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

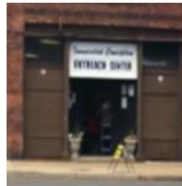

Health News for June 22, 2025



Allergies & Climate Factors. While the timing and severity of an allergy season vary across the country, the following climate factors also can influence how bad your symptoms might be:

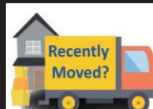
- Tree, grass and ragweed pollens thrive during cool nights and warm days.
 - Molds grow quickly in heat and high humidity.
 - Pollen levels tend to peak in the morning hours.
- Rain washes pollen away, but pollen counts can soar after rainfall.
- On a day with no wind, airborne allergens are grounded.
 - When the day is windy and warm, pollen counts surge.
- Moving to another climate to avoid allergies is usually not successful — allergens are virtually everywhere.
