Dear People of God,

On this so-called "long weekend," we're celebrating the declaration of independence from England (the actual independence wasn't recognized until almost a decade later in 1783 when Washington defeated the British at Yorktown). Independence was a hard won reality which cost the lives of thousands and the destruction of what in today's dollars would be billions in property and possessions. While it's good to celebrate, we ought also to remember the lives sacrificed to earn that independence.

Did you know that Jesus chose to institute the Eucharist on an independence day? I was at the Passover Supper with the disciples when he took bread and wine and shared Body and Blood. Passover was the Hebrew's joyous recollection of the independence won from the Egyptians and their own long, forty-year struggle to earn their independence. On the feast of the Transfiguration, Luke wrote that Jesus was on the mountain discussing with Moses and Elijah "his own exodus" to begin when he arrived in Jerusalem. The exodus of Jesus was the sacrificial event of the Cross; the comparison to the end of the forty-year trek across the desert was his Resurrection from the dead, the ultimate liberation of humanity from the death brought about by Adam's sin.

At any Mass we celebrate that same independence day given to us by the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus so our celebration at Mass ought to look like or feel like what we're experiencing during this long, secular holiday celebration. While we may not conclude the Mass with fireworks, we can lay claim to a distinction that no American citizen can claim: our "founder" remains very much present and with us at Mass while George Washington and all the rest of the Founders lie in the grave awaiting the resurrection.

The Eucharist is also a far better event than celebrating something now almost 250 years into the past because any time we gather to celebrate Mass, we're actually joined to the same Last Supper at which the Apostles first heard the words of consecration. We're also with the people of ages yet to come who will hear those same words on the eve of the Second Coming. Eucharist transcends time and offers us the opportunity to be one with the billions past, present and future who gather around the table of the Lord. 2025 is the last formal year of the Eucharistic Renewal; it is focused on the Mission given by our participation in the Body and Blood of the Lord. Mission means to be sent: the sending at the end of Mass is to "go forth" taking the very presence of Jesus with us out into the world, a world which from my viewpoint certainly needs what Jesus has to offer. While some may think sharing the Good News is a difficult task, it's as easy as giving others a warm smile of recognition. Give it a try.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Christ Child Society of Toledo is looking for women to join its organization. Christ Child is dedicated to serving the needs of underserved children and youth—for the love of the Christ Child.


Christ Child is an all-volunteer organization with more than 200 local members who donate over 15,000 hours annually.

Christ Child's largest program is Clothe-a-Child. Each year the organization purchases and distributes more than 2,000 new coats, hats, gloves, and books to children birth through eighth grade. Through the Layette Program, more than 1,600 layette/newborn care packages are distributed to underserved new moms in the fall and spring.

Christ Child volunteers also tutor and offer library assistance at Rosary Cathedral, Gesu, Queen of Apostles School and Hope Learning Academy. Volunteers also teach classes for new and expectant parents at several local service agencies and assist with other programs including Angel Layettes and Theatre Vision.

The Diocese of Toledo is in compliance with the articles of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (Charter) of the United

States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). Every year, the Diocese dutifully submits the necessary documentation required by the USCCB for a diocese to be in compliance.

Every three years an on-site audit is conducted, when not only all necessary documentation is dutifully submitted, but in addition, Pastoral Center, parish and diocesan school employees are interviewed concerning practices and protocols related to creating and maintaining a safe environment for our children and youth.

The last 3-year audit was conducted in September 2024 and all audited Articles within the Charter were found to be compliant. The next on-site audit will be conducted in 2027.

The Diocese of Toledo remains committed to ensuring the protection of children and providing a safe environment for all young people. If you have any knowledge of abuse that has been committed by a cleric, or any personnel of the Catholic Church, you are urged to report the abuse to your local police department, Children Services, and the Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at (419) 214-4880 or by mail at 1933 Spielbusch Avenue, Toledo, Ohio 43604.

La Diócesis de Toledo está en cumplimiento con los artículos de la Carta para la Protección de Niños y Jóvenes de la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos (USCCB).

Cada año, la Diócesis presenta diligentemente la documentación necesaria requerida por la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos (USCCB, por sus siglas en inglés) para que una diócesis está en cumplimiento. Cada tres años se lleva a cabo una auditoría en el sitio, en la que no solo se presenta debidamente toda la documentación necesaria, sino que, además, se entrevista a los empleados del Centro Pastoral, de las parroquias y de las escuelas diocesanas sobre las prácticas y protocolos relacionados con la creación y el mantenimiento de un entorno seguro para nuestros niños y jóvenes.

La última auditoría de 3 años se realizó en septiembre de 2024. La próxima audioría en el sitio se llevará a cabo en 2027.


