Dear People of God,

I often take it on the chin for something I write in these letters and sure enough, somebody told me off for my comments on the correct posture/behavior for receiving the Eucharist. How dare I say people can't kneel or take the host on their tongue? Oops, I didn't say that. I did write that the Church had good reason to propose a standard means of approaching the altar which is to stand, take the Host or Chalice in our hands and celebrate as if at a real meal because it is a real meal.

Only babies (and perhaps newlyweds in some circumstances) are fed by hand (take it on the tongue) because babies are incapable of using the proper behavioral tools of an adult sharing a meal with friends. I imagine that none of us reading this would think to leave the knife and fork on the table at any of the finer restaurants here in town and wait for somebody beside us to pick things up and stick them in our mouth. Because we know what a meal is and how to behave, we ought to act the same way in Church: despite lining up to get to the distributor, we are at a sacred meal, the same one at which Jesus first handed bread and chalice to his apostles at the last Supper.

Perhaps we could all stand a tutorial in the Last Supper to better understand what we're doing. First, because the supper was a symbolic recollection of an event in the past, the celebrants made use of elements which focus attention on the event being commemorated which was nothing less than the sparing of the Hebrew First Born while those of the Egyptians were subjected to death. As such, it was with happy, joyous laughing and singing and dancing for sheer excitement that the Passover heralded the liberation of a people. Sadly, Mass has become anything but joyous, happy singing and dancing for sheer excitement!

The dinner was taken while reclining (you can hear that mentioned in a couple of the eucharistic prayers) so imagine everybody laying on their sides around a low table, a circle of friends and family. Everything needed was on the table so people didn't have to jump up and down to get anything. The various items were passed from person to person: in the case of the mixture which simulated the mud from which bricks were made, everybody dipped a bit of bread into the mixture together as a sign that "we're all in this one way or the other." Jesus didn't poke the bread into people's mouths because that would have required him to get up, leave the table and come at the Apostles from behind. He passed it from his hands to the hands of the people with him.

I may be wrong, but I suspect the bread he chose to share was the Afikomen, half an unleavened loaf ceremoniously shared at the end of the ritual meal. The chalice was the Cup of Jeremiah, a glass of wine which sat at the table from beginning to end and was shared by everyone as a sign that the prophet was near at hand to announce the Messiah was coming for everyone.

## The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.






