

Dear People of God,

This coming Friday is the Solemnity of the Assumption; because it's on a weekday, it's an obliged Holy Day. I read often enough that our young people are falling way behind in reading skills and vocabulary (no wonder considering the use of the most bazaar abbreviations to communicate on so-called social media) so I thought it might be a good idea to refresh ourselves on that word "obliged."

An obligation is something we owe another, something we must give or perform. We have no choice but must do it. That means we cannot pick and choose which holy days we want to celebrate and forget the rest; it is not our option to do that. The expectation of the Church is that we cannot claim to be Catholic unless we show up at an obliged celebration, whatever that might be. The Church hasn't picked the Holy Days of Obligation just to have a few. Each one is a singular event which touches on our own connection to the promises of God, an opportunity to reflect on what God has done so we can be filled with hope at what God will do (for each of us).

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary recalls that following her death, as a special favor in light of the future resurrection of the dead obtained for us by Christ's own death and resurrection, Mary was spared the usual burial and lengthy resting until the End Times. Instead, she was raised to life in her perfected body and taken immediately into heaven to be with her son. That alone should invite all of us to gather in praise of the child whose love for his mother provided such a miracle.

However, as a famous newsman once said, "there's more to the story. . ." The Assumption of Mary pre -figures our own glorious rising from the dead, our physical body perfected so it will no longer grow old, infirm or weak. That promise of resurrection and eternal life with God should be a powerful draw summoning us to the celebration at Church in thanksgiving for what lies ahead for the faithful. All to often we forget that Eucharist means thanksgiving and thus we overlook wonderful opportunities to say a hearty "Thank You' for things we've received and things yet to come.

Mary's Assumption offers us some insights into what eternal life is going to be like. If we follow her many apparitions, we can see that heaven allows us to become one with a universal Body of Christ. She appears to those privileged to see her as one of their own, inviting different cultures and races to feel comfortable that heaven isn't going to be a shock but a warm welcome to a familiar reality. We can be reassured that our own entrance into heaven will be a wonderful moment of recognition and reunion with family and friends. This is all illuminated for us at the celebration of the Assumption. I invite everyone to come to Mass and share in the vision of heaven provided by our reflecting on Mary's own warm welcome to the Kingdom.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.


Order of Christian Initiation of Adults: OCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Health News for August 10, 2025



Causes of Bruxism. Several factors appear to have a role in the development of the condition. They include:

- Psychosocial factors: stress, mood, distress, nervousness, and "feeling blue"
 - A person's genes
 - Consuming alcohol or caffeine
 - Smoking
- Medications: Certain medicines used to treat depression, seizures, and attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) may increase the chances of having bruxism

Christ Child is an all-volunteer organization with more than 200 local members who donate over 15,000 hours annually.

Christ Child's largest program is Clothe-a-Child. Each year the organization purchases and distributes more than 2,000 new coats, hats, gloves, and books to children birth through eighth grade. Through the Layette Program, more than 1,600 layette/newborn care packages are distributed to underserved new moms in the fall and spring.

Christ Child volunteers also tutor and offer library assistance at Rosary Cathedral, Gesu, Queen of Apostles School and Hope Learning Academy. Volunteers also teach classes for new and expectant parents at several local service agencies and assist with other programs including Angel Layettes and Theatre Vision.
