Pope Francis

Dear People of God,

Although today is still August, tomorrow is Labor Day, dedicated in our Diocese to the dignity of human labor. You may wish to join the cathedral in a special celebration of those who work as part of your holiday celebration and hold off on burning the hot dogs for a while.

The Church Universal actually has its own "labor day," the feast of Joseph the Worker on May 1. The celebration was instituted in 1955 by Pope Pius XII as a counterbalance to the Communist claim that they were the patrons of the worker. The pope said, in part: "There could not be a better protector to help you penetrate the spirit of the Gospel into your life ... From the heart of the Man-God, Savior of the world, this spirit flows into you and into all men; but it is certain that no worker has ever been as perfectly and deeply penetrated by it as the putative father of Jesus, who lived with him in the closest intimacy and commonality of family and work."

For the Church, labor is something people should be able to choose according to their gifts and talents, not a requirement or burden placed on the shoulders by a totalitarian government. Any work is something that brings dignity to the worker and, as Paul wrote, "the laborer is worthy of his hire" so that the Church has always stood for a fair wage, decent working conditions which are safe and which provide adequate materials and tools for its accomplishment.

Pope Leo XIII issued a major commentary on work in 1889 in which he included a statement about Jospeh as a role model for all who labor. He wrote: "Joseph became the guardian, the administrator, and the legal defender of the divine house whose chief he was. And during the whole course of his life he fulfilled those charges and those duties. He set himself to protect with a mighty love and a daily solicitude his spouse and the Divine Infant; regularly by his work he earned what was necessary for the one and the other for nourishment and clothing; he guarded from death the Child threatened by a monarch's jealousy, and found for him a refuge; in the miseries of the journey and in the bitterness's of exile he was ever the companion, the assistance, and the upholder of the Virgin and of Jesus."

While many today believe work should reward us far beyond the actual value of what we do, note that Leo pointed out that work should reward us what we need and not necessarily all the extra for that condo in Aspen, the boat on Lake Erie and that Rolex we didn't buy from a street vendor in New York. Happy Labor Day and thanks to all who work to make our lives here in Toledo a wonderful experience! May God bless you all.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults: OCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call the church @ 419-243-1829.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

<u>Matrimony</u>: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.





Join us on September 6th at 3:30 pm as Dan Streeter leads us in the Holy Rosary.



Health News for August 31, 2025

Treatment of Bruxism. Here are some possible treatments you may wish to discuss with your healthcare provider(s):

- Behavior Change: Change the resting mouth and jaw position to reduce the clenching and grinding of teeth.
 Increase awareness and reduce clenching and grinding habits.
- Stress Management: Reduce stress-related responses, which may decrease bruxism
 - Mouth Guards (intraoral appliances): use a mouth guard to separate the teeth; this prevents tooth damage and may reduce muscle activity due to grinding and clenching.

Dental Treatment: Repair teeth that have been chipped or worn away. Crowns or other procedures may be needed.


